Originally a 12th-century Templar stronghold, when the order was dissolved in the 14th century the Portuguese branch was turned into the Knights of the Order of Christ, that later supported Portugal's maritime discoveries of the 15th century. The convent and castle complex is a historic and cultural monument and was listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site in 1983.</p>

The Sanctuary of Fátima



The **Sanctuary of Fátima** ([Portuguese](#): *Santuário de Fátima*), also known as **Sanctuary of Our Lady of Fátima** (*Santuário de Nossa Senhora de Fátima*), is a group of [Catholic](#) religious buildings and structures in [Cova da Iria](#), in the [civil parish](#) of [Fátima](#), in the municipality of [Ourém](#), in [Portugal](#).

[Chapel of the Apparitions](#) (*Capelinha das Aparições*) which contains the area where three children, [Lúcia dos Santos](#) and her cousins, [Francisco and Jacinta Marto](#), said they were first visited by the [Virgin Mary](#). In addition, several other structures and monuments were built in the intervening years to commemorate the events.
